WHEN HIS architect asked Sir James Miller in 1901 how much money to spend on the house he was having built in the Scottish Borders, Sir James apparently replied: "It doesn't matter." The silver-plated main staircase at Manderston is a great example of Sir James' casual attitude to spending money.
